## Short Summary (important points)

The Extreme Dialogue project aims to reduce the appeal of extremism among young people via a series of short films and educational resources that can be used in classrooms or community settings and are intended to build resilience to extremism through active discussion and enhanced critical thinking. The project has brought together an international consortium of expertise including the Institute for Strategic Dialogue, the educational charity the Tim Parry Jonhathan Ball Foundation for Peace and film – makers Duckrabbit.

This project has been funded with support from the European Commission. The resource pack is aimed primarily at young people aged 14 - 18 years. Whilst these may be the primary age groups, it could easily be used with audiences a little older or perhaps even a little younger depending on their maturity levels and levels of support. The resource or exercises within it could also be used with and by those tasked with working with young people as an opportunity to further explore issues surrounding extremism and radicalization.
