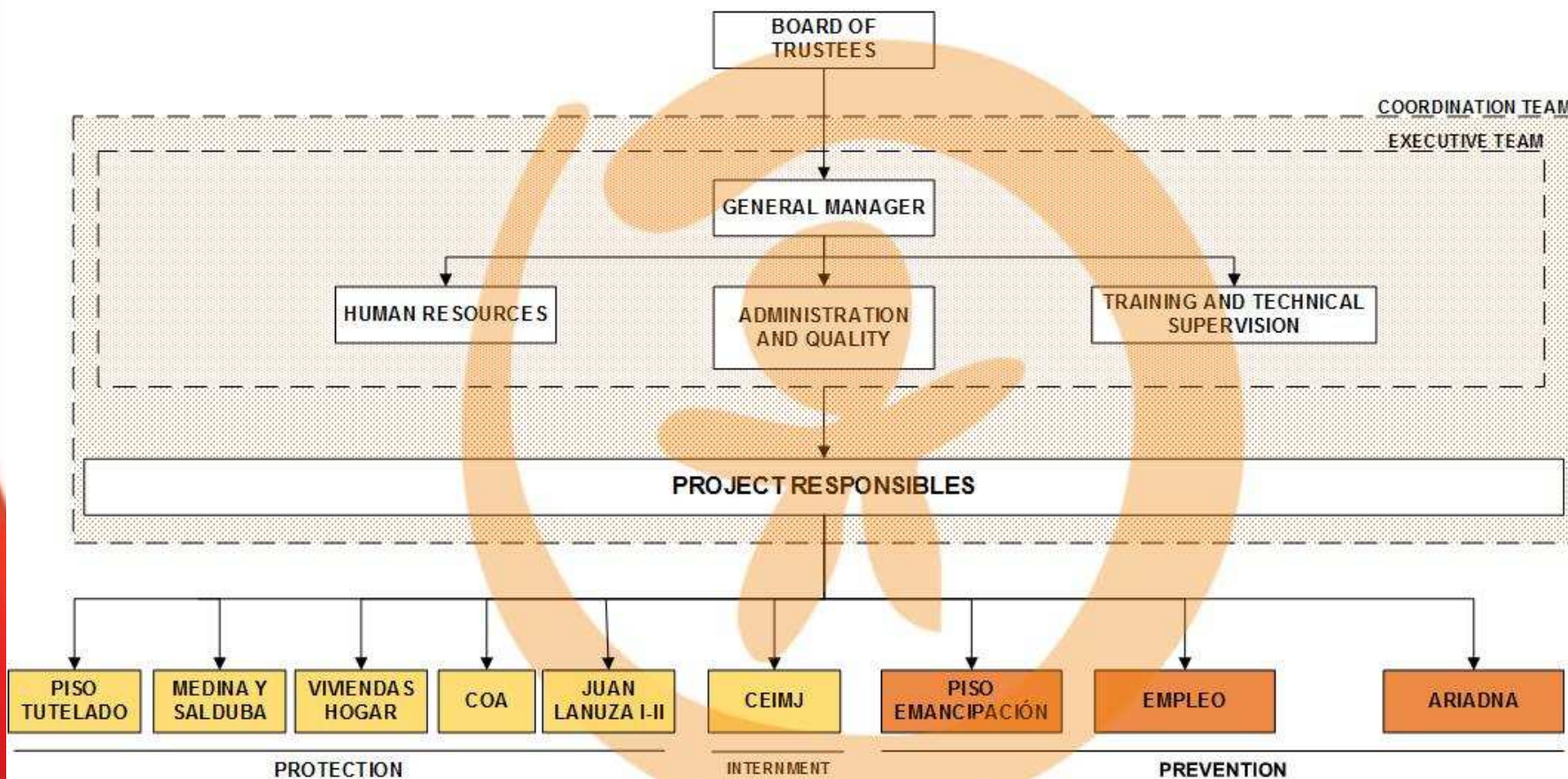
Who are we?

Its main goals are to support and promote **minors and children's integral development** as well as to defend the minor's prior interest. As a part of it, FAIM works with families in order to strengthen their parental competencies.

PROTECTION

- **COA I y COA II**
 - Reception minors in social risk: observation, diagnosis and referral
- **Juan de Lanuza 1 y 2**
 - Special Residential Unit for minors with behaviour disorders
- **Medina Albaida y Salduba**
 - Residential Units for children in adoption process (or after its failure)
- **Viviendas Hogar y Pisos Tutelados**
 - Offer a space of secure and family style life to minors in social risk

JUDICIARY MEASURES

- **CEIMJ** – Public Reclusion Centre for young and minors to accomplish Judiciary measures imposed to them. It includes different programmes and units as: minimum level, medium level, therapeutic, maximum level and work release

SOCIALIZATION PROGRAMS

- **Labour insertion** Program: supports youngster from CEIMJ as well as from Judiciary Measures (in normal life) to seek, find and preserve a job.
- **Piso de Emancipación**: Supervised Apartment to provide a platform to individual autonomy after reclusion or judiciary measures
- **Espacio Ariadna**: psychological and education programme supporting families which suffer from domestic violence (children against parents)



faim *Basic Data 2014*

- 336 minors attended (residentially)
- 160 professionals implied, including social educators and social workers, labour insertors, psychologists, teachers, nurses, doctors and psychiatrists.
- 9 residential centres (CEIMJ, COA I, COA II, 4 pisos tutelados, 1 piso emancipación), 1 labor insertion program and a non-residential program supporting families that suffer from domestic violence (against parents)
- 5.749.920 € annual budget
- 97% Public Funding from Aragon Government through Service Contracts for 7 of our 10 centres)



- ❖ Knowledge and experience sharing. Benchmarking as a result of our experiences and methodologies sharing.
- ❖ Give way to technicians, give a chance to test their work and support it with other countries expertise and proposals
