

The Criminal Sanctions Agency (Rise*)

is responsible for enforcement of sentences in Finland. It operates under the direction of the Ministry of Justice and implements the criminal policy defined by the Ministry.

The primary duty of the Criminal Sanctions Agency is to see that the sentences passed by the courts of the law are enforced lawfully and safely in Finland. In particular, the Agency's goal is to enhance the safety of society by decreasing sentenced offenders' risk of reoffering.



- **Capacity 172 places / 79 for women**
- **Largest closed prison for female inmates in Finland**
- **4 wards for men / 5 for women / 1 family unit / 2 for temporary accomodation**
 - **Remand prisoners: 10 men / 31 women,**
 - **Convicted prisoners: 80 men / 41 women**
 - **Fine defaulters: 3 men / 2 women**
 - **Foreign prisoners: 2 men / 19 women**
- **Personnel 133**
- **Budget 8,5 million eur**
