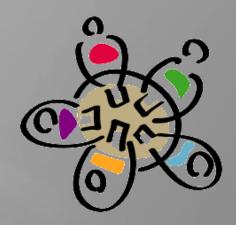

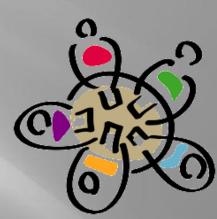


Presentation and Role of the different types of groups represented in the project

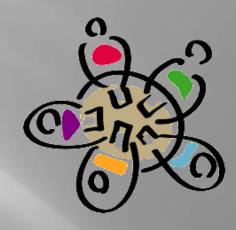
