Dear guests, Welcome in Belgium!

We will work in Diepenbeek and Mol and stay in Hasselt.

Hasselt (Dutch pronunciation: ['fiosəlt]) is a Belgian city and municipality, and capital of the province of Limburg. The centre is mostly car-free and contains a number of historical buildings. Among the oldest buildings in the town centre are the St. Quentin's Cathedral (11th to 18th centuries). The Grand Place and the nearby streets are lined with restaurants brasseries, cafes and taverns.

The Demerstraat and the Koning Albertstraat are the most important shopping streets. In the Kapelstraat and the Hoogstraat are expensive shops with the most famous brands. Another major religious building, besides the cathedral, is the Virga Jesse Basilica. The churches must cede domination of the skyline of the city to the modern twin towers of the "TT-wijk", however. In 2003, the renovation of this complex, now including a shopping mall and a hotel, gave the centre a new boost. In 2004, Hasselt was the first city to receive the title "most sociable city of the region of Flanders", and has since claimed the title of "Capital City of Taste".

1. If you fly to Charleroi (Brussels South) you can take a shuttle bus to the train station of Brussels-Midi (South). Please see attachment titled Flibco.

In Brussels-midi you take the train to Hasselt:

*Direct 12min after every hour, direction Genk, 1h18min travel time

*Direct 45min after every hour, direction Tongeren, 1h04min travel time

2. If you fly to Brussels national airport you best take the train:

*Direct to Hasselt, 21 min after every hour, 1h01min travel time

*More possibilities via shuttle trains, you need to switch 1 or 2 times (Brussels North our Louvain).

3. Back home on Saturday

*Direct to Brussels national airport, 37min after hour, 1h13min travel time (diabolo tax) *Direct to Brussels Midi (South), 1h18min travel time, 30min after every hour.
