Prison and Terrorism - Radicalisation and De-radicalisation in 15 countries

The role prisons pay in radicalising people and reforming them. It examines the policies and best practices that can help governments and policy makers. It speaks about how the terrorist recruits, the individual who is radicalised and what can be done.

Improve general conditions, avoid overcrowding and allow stable inmates identities. Prison Imams are important but not the panacea of everything.

- Different kind of programmes ideological and/or religious re-education with vocational training
- Credible interlocutors are key
- Facilitating prisoners' transition from prison to mainstream society
- Locking prisoners into commitments and obligations towards family, community and state
- Inducement help, but material incentive are not decisive
