The Observatory of Prevention against Radicalism (O.P.R.A) is a non-profit association born in Barcelona in 2016 and arises from the need to give a preventive response to the increase of violent radicalization suffered among young people in our society. The Observatory is responsible for promoting projects and research on violent radicalization and its prevention and detection. It also promotes the counter-narrative of extremist groups, violent urban groups and terrorist organizations.

Among the actions developed by the association, the following are to be highlighted:

- quarterly talks in Compulsory Secondary Education and Baccalaureate for the prevention of violence, radicalization and violent extremism.

- every two months, a master lecture given by prestigious professionals followed by open debates.

- two intervention models:

1. Individualized care and assistance to young people and families who detect signs of radicalization.

2. Training in the detection of radicalization signs in minors to health services, educational centers and other institutions or associations that require it.

Also, the association carries out two annual investigations with the objective of obtaining new knowledge and applying them to the resolution of conflicts and scientific questions.

By creating a unique model of workshop to teach in primary and another in secondary education, *these two projects* aim to:

- prevent radicalization and violent extremism in minors

- know the citizen's perception of radicalization and violent extremism.

- raise awareness of the social reality about these violent phenomena.
