

Scotland's Prisons

- 15 institutions (capacity of 8,512)
- 7929 prisoners (143 per 100,000)

There are fifteen prisons, two of which are privately run.

In response to current trends, a statutory presumption against prison sentences of less than three months has been introduced. The Scottish Prison Service are also moving towards the creation of community custody units to strengthen the focus on community integration and intensive family support.

Reoffending is also a major cause for concern across the UK as a whole with over 45% of adults being reconvicted within a year of being released. The cost of this reoffending is estimated to cost the taxpayer between 11 and 15 million Euros per year (Prisoners' Education Trust).



Scottish Prison Service Strategy

Unlocking Potential, Transforming Lives

The Scottish Prison Service education strategy (2016) centres around the mantra Unlocking Potential and Transforming Lives. Every prisoner in their care should now have:

"the opportunity to engage in creative and flexible learning that unlocks [their] potential and inspires change and builds individual strength".

It seeks to achieve this through an education provision which blends formal, non-formal and informal learning activities.


- We have published 14 issues, printing over 22,000 copies in all.

- We now receive approximately 340 submissions per issue

















